- 1. Share best practices across Boards with regard to recruitment and selection processes for each of the target groups, with a view to ensuring that each dual credit programs seats are filled on par with provincial averages.
- 2. Identify and implement strategies to increase the number of dual credit students who register and successfully transition to College through the following strategies:
 - 2.1 Colleges to share baseline data with Boards regarding 2015-16 dual credit students in college programs.
 - 2.2 Incorporate advising services/programs for students in the SWAC/ Centers for Success.
